◇ Blessing of Palms at all Masses
◇ When you arrive home place the palm in a place of significance (near a cross or holy picture) to remember the Lord's entry into Jerusalem and our own journey of faith.

7.30pm 2nd Rite of Reconciliation - St Mark's Drummoyne

Wednesday: * **9.00am Mass**

* Chrism Mass in St Mary's Cathedral, Sydney at 10.30am
Blessing of the Holy Oils. Oil of Catechumens, Oil of Chrism, Oil of the Sick. All are invited to attend.

Please note: It is recommended that we enter into the Sacred Triduum having already celebrated the Sacrament of Reconciliation, so you are encouraged to receive this sacrament before these Sacred days. For this reason there is no Reconciliation scheduled for Good Friday or Holy Saturday

† THE EASTER TRIDUUM †

7.30PM MASS OF THE LORD'S SUPPER

- ◇ Washing of the feet ritualizes the Christian ideal of leadership in service, a service which Christ expresses fully when he lays down his life on the cross.
- ◇ Gifts for the poor (Project Compassion) are brought forward by the people with the bread and wine.
- ◇ Blessed Sacrament will be taken in procession to the altar of repose, for adoration until 10.30pm. (You might like to return later for some quiet time of prayer and reflection)
- ◇ Until Easter we keep the Paschal Fast - live simply and try to keep a reflective and prayerful spirit.

GOOD FRIDAY:

- * **10.00am Stations of the Cross (English)**
- * **3.00pm Celebration of the Lord's Passion**
- ◇ *Liturgy of the Word - Readings, homily, solemn intercessions.*
- ◇ *Veneration of the Cross.*
- ◇ *Holy Communion (from the Mass of the Lord's Supper).*
- * **7.30pm Stations of the Cross (Italian)**



HOLY SATURDAY: All Masses are prohibited from after the Mass of Holy Thursday evening until the Vigil

- ◇ All celebration of the sacraments is strictly prohibited
- ◇ Communion may only be given as viaticum (Communion for the Dying)

EASTER SEASON

7.00pm EASTER SATURDAY VIGIL (NO 6.15am Italian Mass)

Mass (starts outside church)

- ◇ Service of Light, Procession (Remember to bring your Baptismal Candle)
- ◇ Liturgy of the Word
- ◇ Readings, psalms, prayers, Gloria and homily.
- ◇ Liturgy of Baptism
- ◇ Blessing of Water, renewal of Baptismal promises.
- ◇ Liturgy of Eucharist
- ◇ Concluding Rite
- ◇ Dismissal with triple Alleluia.

- * You are invited to take home the Easter Water after Mass.
The Easter Newsletter (Bulletin) will have a special prayer for the Blessing of the home.

THE EASTER SEASON: The fifty days from Easter Sunday to Pentecost are celebrated in joyful exultation as one feast day, or better as one 'great Sunday' (St Athanasius). The Sundays of this season rank as Paschal Sundays.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Philippians 3:8-14

I believe nothing can happen that will outweigh the supreme advantage of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord. For him I have accepted the loss of everything, and I look on everything as so much rubbish if only I can have Christ and be given a place in him. I am no longer trying for perfection by my own efforts, the perfection that comes from the Law, but I want only the perfection that comes through faith in Christ, and is from God and based on faith. All I want is to know Christ and the power of his resurrection and to share his sufferings by reproducing the pattern of his death. That is the way I can hope to take my place in the resurrection of the dead. Not that I have become perfect yet: I have not yet won, but I am still running, trying to capture the prize for which Christ Jesus captured me. I can assure you my brothers, I am far from thinking that I have already won. All I can say is that I forget the past and I strain ahead for what is still to come; I am racing for the finish, for the prize to which God calls us upwards to receive in Christ Jesus.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John 8:1-11
