Something to Think About

Think of all the people who have done something for you today, or helped you in some way. Did you remember to say 'thank you' to each of those people?

The Story

Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem when he saw ten men with a bad skin disease. At that time, people thought that sickness was the result of punishment for some kind of sin. These men had to live away from their families and villages. Jesus healed the ten men, but only one came back to say thank you. This story shows us how important it is to be thankful.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Luke

17:11-19

On his way to Jerusalem, Jesus went along the border between Samaria and Galilee. As he was going into a village, ten men with leprosy came toward him. They stood at a distance and shouted, "Jesus, Master, have pity on us!"

Jesus looked at them and said, "Go show yourselves to the priests."

On their way they were healed. When one of them discovered that he was healed, he came back, shouting praises to God. He bowed down at the feet of Jesus and thanked him. The man was from the country of Samaria.

Jesus asked, "Weren't ten men healed? Where are the other nine? Why was this foreigner the only one who came back to thank God?"

Then Jesus told the man, "You may get up and go. Your faith has made you well."

The Gospel of the Lord. **Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.**

Group Discussion

Invite the children to name some of their gifts. Then give time for them to say a silent prayer of thanks to God.

Invite the children to pray for their own special intentions.

Leader: Loving God, listen to the prayers we make in the name of Jesus.

All: Amen.

Amen.

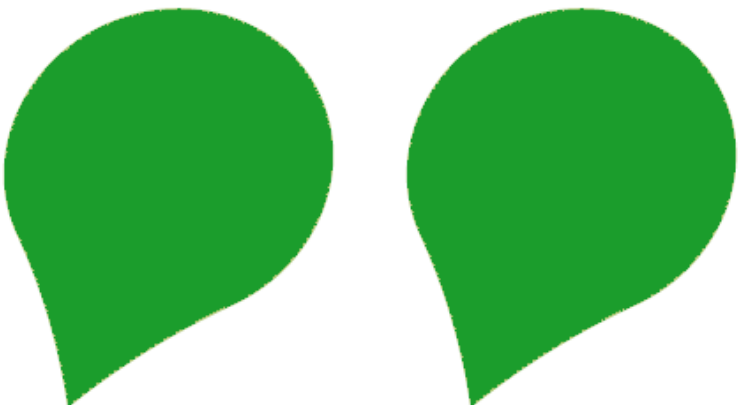
Group Activity

Thank you

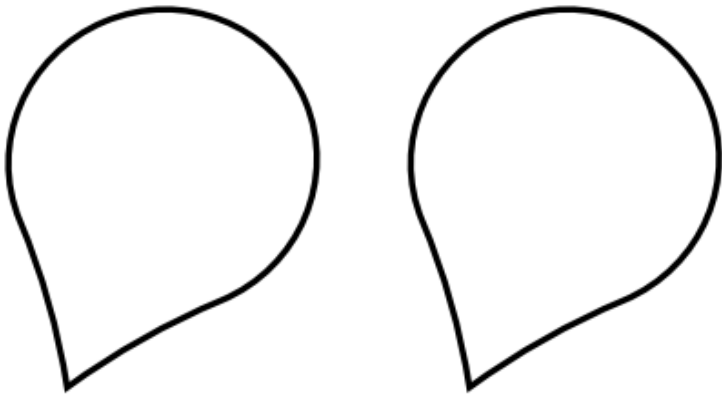
You will need: paint and paintbrush, A4 blank paper, template either in colour or black & white for each child, glue.
