What does it mean to have faith?

The Story

The woman in this story is a stranger and a foreigner, but she asks Jesus for help. Firstly Jesus doesn't answer her, but she asks again. Jesus reminds the woman that he was sent only to the people of Israel. The disciples try to send her away, but she doesn't give up.

She displays great faith, more faith, in fact than the disciples ever show! Jesus notices the woman's faith and he changes his mind. Jesus gives her what she wants. The woman's daughter is healed.

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

15:21-28

Jesus went to the territory near the cities of Tyre and Sidon. Suddenly a Canaanite woman from there came out shouting, "Lord and Son of David, have pity on me! My daughter is full of demons."

Jesus did not say a word. But the woman kept following along and shouting, so his disciples came up and asked him to send her away.

Jesus said, "I was sent only to the people of Israel! They are like a flock of lost sheep."


The woman came closer. Then she kneeled down and begged, "Lord, please help me!"

Jesus replied, "It isn't right to take food away from children and feed it to dogs." "Lord, that's true," the woman said, "but even dogs get the crumbs that fall from their owner's table."

Group Discussion

Jesus spent time with this woman who was a foreigner and a stranger. Who, today, would you consider a foreigner and a stranger? Maybe they are people we have not yet met or whom we have judged to be 'different'. Discuss with the children.

It is easy to be kind and friendly to neighbours. Invite the children to think about ways they can reach out to other children who may not be their close friends. What would be some practical and safe ways of 'reaching out' to others?

Group Activity


Shaping Our Faith
