Safeguarding Adults at Risk



Even the weakest and most vulnerable, the sick, the old, the unborn and the poor, are masterpieces of God's creation, made in his own image, destined to live for ever, and deserving of the utmost reverence and respect.

REFLECTION

"Anyone who loses his life for my sake will find it."

The "pig and chicken" principle has been quoted by people in many diverse fields of human endeavour, to encourage total dedication to a cause – whether it be Scott Morrison, when Australian Prime Minister, asking for commitment to his political agenda, or coach Mike Leach encouraging players to give 100 per cent for his American Football team. The principle is based on the fable of the pig and the chicken who were discussing the possibility of opening a restaurant. "We could call it: 'Bacon and Eggs'," says the chicken. "Each of us could make our own unique contribution to the menu." The pig considers it for a brief moment: "The problem with that," he says, "is that you'd only be involved, but I'd have to be totally committed."

Gospel Teaching

Jesus says: "If anyone wants to be a follower of mine, let him renounce himself and take up his cross and follow me." What he is asking for is more than simply being involved in his project, but total dedication, even to the point of self-sacrifice. It seems a strange strategy for attracting followers. And indeed, the Gospels tell us that many potential disciples did walk away from Jesus. He asks people not simply to make a one-off decision for him, but rather to walk the walk and not simply talk the talk. He is asking for genuine disciples, not fair-weather admirers. That initial decision for him has to be translated into lifelong and total dedication, even when the consequences are painful.

We see this dynamic played out in the life of the prophet Jeremiah in the first reading. The full reality of his decision to follow God's calling by becoming the Lord's prophet is starting to hit home for Jeremiah. His decision has led to humiliation, rejection, imprisonment, even danger of death. Costly discipleship indeed. And yet it almost seems as if Jeremiah has no choice – not because God has forced him, but rather because Jeremiah feels seduced by God, he can't forget the Lord. Even when he is sick of God and all the demands the Lord makes on him, there is nevertheless something so utterly attractive about God, something enthralling, a fire burning in his heart, as Jeremiah says, that he cannot resist.

Jesus states quite bluntly that following him will cost. Taking up the cross is not a one-off decision, but a way of life, a way of living life. As St Paul tells the Christians in Rome, it involves changing our mind,

putting on the mind of Christ, who came not to be served but to serve and to offer his life as a ransom for many. For Paul, it means changing our behaviour, and offering our bodies, our whole lives, as a sacrifice which is pleasing to God. Perhaps Peter tried to stop Jesus going to the cross not simply because he cared for Jesus, but because he guessed that where Jesus went, he would have to follow. Jesus' response to Peter is also an invitation to every would-be follower: "Get behind me." In other words, "Take your place as my disciple, my follower. Follow me on the road to the cross, and I promise you life, joy and fulfilment."

You may also want to speak to your Parish Priest who will be able to provide support and guidance. The Archdiocese has a legal obligation to report crimes to the police.

Safeguarding- What should I know as a parent?

Is the Parish a 'child safe organisation'?

St Joan of Arc Haberfield Parish is committed to safeguarding children.

Parish members teaching your child are trained in ways to protect and k

Parish members teaching your child are trained in ways to protect and keep your child safe from harm. They understand and have signed the **Code of Conduct** for working with children and young people.



The Office of the Children's Guardian, in NSW, has checked and cleared our parish members to be able to work with children. The parish members have been issued a **Working With Children Check** (WWCC) clearance number.

Engaging a Tutor/Coach

If you **engage a tutor**, private trainer etc., you should ask for a Working With Children Check clearance number and verify the WWC online.

It's the law that tutors or coaches who work with your children must have a **Working With Children Check**.









Children's modelling and acting

In NSW there are specific laws to protect the safety and wellbeing of children under the age of 15 years who are **employed** as actors, performers, and in door-to-door sales, and children under the age of 16 who are **employed as models**. The Office of the Children's Guardian is responsible for authorising employers of children. You can check the **Register of Authorised Employers** on the OCG website.

SAFE Series activity books/videos for Children

The Office of the Children's Guardian has developed the SAFE series of Children's activity books and videos containing personal **safety messages for children** that parents can utilise when explaining personal issues, such as to: Help your child identify the parts of their **body that are private**

Help your child understand their feelings

Encourage your child to think about **five people who they trust** to help them if they feel scared, sad or upset.
