Something to Think About

Imagine if Jesus was in the world today. Who might be the people to welcome and follow him? Who might reject him or be challenged by him?

The Story

The Scriptures

A reading from the holy gospel according to Matthew

21:28-32

Jesus said:

"I will tell you a story about a man who had two sons. Then you can tell me what you think.

The father went to the older son and said,

'Go work in the vineyard today!'

His son told him that he would not do it, but later he changed his mind and went.

The man then told his younger son to go work in the vineyard. The boy said he would, but he didn't go. Which one of the sons obeyed his father?"

"The older one," the chief priests and leaders answered.

Then Jesus told them:

"You can be sure that tax collectors and bad women will get into the kingdom of God before you ever will! When John the Baptist showed you how to do right, you would not believe him. But these evil people did believe. And even when you saw what they did, you still would not change your minds and believe."

Group Discussion

Group Activity


Keys to Obedience
