From the Pastor

. Empty tomb was a scandal. The women who looked for the body of Jesus to anoint it were devastated to see the empty tomb. They thought that Jesus who was unjustly killed is also denied of a decent burial rites. Though Jesus taught them of his resurrection they did not think of to be literal. Therefore, the resurrection of

Jesus was a surprise for all who heard the news. But the disciples experienced a very powerful presence of the resurrected Christ. The Gospels do not tell us the details of their experience. But it was powerful enough that they risked their life to preach the resurrected Christ is public. Their experience of resurrected Christ was so intense that they kept on gathering to 'Break Bread'. The blessed bread and wine created an intimate bonding with Christ, Holy Communion. Thereafter the disciples of Christ gathered to have a holy union with Christ so that their lives will not finish with their death. Our sins are forgiven through Christ, and we are made a holy people. It is a mystery to be experienced like two people fallen in love. Love cannot be explained but has to be experienced. Similarly, Easter experience is also a mystery to be experienced, not explained.

The newly blessed Easter Water is made available in small containers for you to take away to bless your homes. It is best done with the whole household praying together. The sprinkling of the holy water could be done by an adult member of the family.

Should you like me to come to pray with your family and bless your house, I will be available from 3rd week of April onwards. (I will be on a clergy conference on the second week). Please contact the office by email or telephone to make an appointment.

My first Holy Week here has been an extraordinary experience of comradery of parishioners who plays various roles. The varied decoration of the Church on different days of the Holy Week, the liturgical planning, singing and music, Ministry at the Altar, and so on are great examples of how much you love the parish as a faith family. I am proud to be here and be at your service.

I would like to be in touch with all my parishioners. There was a time when the priests made systematic visit of all families in the parish. Though that is not practical these days, we are blessed with digital communication provisions. Therefore, appeal you to send an email with your name and email address to admin@stjoanofarc.org.au. Once I have a list of it I shall work on being in touch with constantly and share with you parish news and announcements like funeral of parishioners. Should you be interested I can also share some spiritual/Biblical reflection.

Writings by the Fathers of the Church

The Lord's descent into the underworld

From an ancient homily for Holy Saturday

Something strange is happening – there is a great silence on earth today, a great silence and stillness. The whole earth keeps silence because the King is asleep. The earth trembled and is still because God has fallen asleep in the flesh and he has raised up all who have slept ever since the world began. God has died in the flesh and hell trembles with fear.

He has gone to search for our first parent, as for a lost sheep. Greatly desiring to visit those who live in darkness and in the shadow of death, he has gone to free from sorrow the captives Adam and Eve, he who is both God and the son of Eve. The Lord approached them bearing the cross, the weapon that had won him the victory. At the sight of him Adam, the first man he had created, struck his breast in terror and cried out to everyone: "My Lord be with you all." Christ answered him: "And with your spirit." He took him by the hand and raised him up, saying: "Awake, O sleeper, and rise from the dead, and Christ will give you light."

I am your God, who for your sake have become your son. Out of love for you and for your descendants I now by my own authority command all who are held in bondage to come forth, all who are in darkness to be enlightened, all who are sleeping to arise. I order you, O sleeper, to awake. I did not create you to be held a prisoner in hell. Rise from the dead, for I am the life of the dead. Rise up, work of my hands, you who were created in my image. Rise, let us leave this place, for you are in me and I am in you; together we form only one person and we cannot be separated. For your sake I, your God, became your son; I, the Lord, took the form of a slave; I, whose home is above the heavens, descended to the earth

and beneath the earth. For your sake, for the sake of man, I became like a man without help, free among the dead. For the sake of you, who left a garden, I was betrayed to the Jews in a garden, and I was crucified in a garden.

See on my face the spittle I received in order to restore to you the life I once breathed into you. See there the marks of the blows I received in order to refashion your warped nature in my image. On my back see the marks of the scourging I endured to remove the burden of sin that weighs upon your back. See my hands, nailed firmly to a tree, for you who once wickedly stretched out your hand to a tree.

I slept on the cross and a sword pierced my side for you who slept in paradise and brought forth Eve from your side. My side has healed the pain in yours. My sleep will rouse you from your sleep in hell. The sword that pierced me has sheathed the sword that was turned against you.

Rise, let us leave this place. The enemy led you out of the earthly paradise. I will not restore you to that paradise, but I will enthrone you in heaven. I forbade you the tree that was only a symbol of life, but see, I who am life itself am now one with you. I appointed cherubim to guard you as slaves are guarded, but now I make them worship you as God. The throne formed by cherubim awaits you, its bearers swift and eager. The bridal chamber is adorned, the banquet is ready, the eternal dwelling places are prepared, the treasure houses of all good things lie open. The kingdom of heaven has been prepared for you from all eternity.

Reflection on John 20:1-9

Historical Context - Mary Magdalene

Mary Magdalene, or Mary of Magdala, plays an important role in the gospel accounts of the resurrection. She was obviously a significant follower of Jesus, being named as a witness to the crucifixion, discovering the empty tomb and the first to encounter the risen Christ. One would think that she would hold a prestigious place in the Church, but for many years she was confused with another character identified in the gospels and was portrayed as a prostitute and sinner. Mary is named in each of the four gospels and not once is it indicated that she was a sinner or prostitute. She has been a victim of mistaken identity for 2000 years.

Gospel Focus – The disciple Jesus loved

In this week's gospel we see reference to a disciple as 'the one Jesus loved'. It is generally agreed that this disciple is John. There is some suggestion that the disciple, John, is in fact the John ascribed as the author of this gospel. If this is so, to describe himself as the disciple Jesus loved is merely a means of avoiding using a personal pronoun – I or me. Just as Jesus described himself as 'the Son of God' or 'the Son of Man' rather than say 'I', John uses the same convention to avoid naming himself. It is not to suggest that Jesus didn't love his other disciples.

Different View – An empty tomb?

There are some writers who have questioned the historical accuracy of the empty tomb account of the resurrection. Some theologians and biblical scholars (e.g. members of the 'Jesus Seminar') argue that historically, it is far more likely that the victim of Roman crucifixion would be left to rot on the cross or buried in a shallow criminal's grave – not laid to rest in an expensive private tomb. However, they do not argue against resurrection. They maintain that Jesus' body was not 'resuscitated' or 'reanimated'. What happened to his corpse, they argue, is irrelevant to Christ's resurrection.

REFLECTION Easter Readings:

War, disease, famine, and economic uncertainty are part of our daily news. The global scenario is depressing, and we feel for the numerous civilian victims. What can we do and how can we respond as we celebrate the resurrection of the Lord?

Our primary response must be one of hope even in the midst of these global catastrophes. Our hope is based on the fundamental Christian belief that Jesus Christ rose from the dead and without this belief our faith is futile, and we are a people living with a delusion.

Despite the work of the 'masters of suspicion': Karl Marx, Sigmund Freud and Friedrich Nietszche who proposed respectively that religion was "the opium of the people," "an illusion," and that "God is dead," these critiques need to be addressed in our lives and our response is based on the scriptures and our lived experience.

John's gospel tells us the story of Mary of Magdala who came to the tomb early in the morning and saw the stone removed. She ran to Simon Peter and the other disciples to tell them the news. Simon Peter and the 'beloved disciple' ran to the tomb and the younger man waited until Simon Peter arrived and entered the tomb.

He saw the linen cloths on the ground and the cloth that had been over his head. Peter sees the fact that there is no body and observes the details, but the 'beloved disciple' then entered the tomb and we hear that "he saw, and he believed." Peter is the leader of the followers of Jesus, but the unnamed 'beloved disciple' is the model disciple and believer.

While Mary of Magdala is the bearer of the news, it is Peter who proclaims the good news to the household of the Gentile Cornelius and his household. The message of Jesus is not just good news for the Jews but good news for all people.

The good news has influenced the lives of many people who are sustained by their belief especially when they experience difficulties in their lives. They also bear witness by their lives to the difference that faith makes to our lives. Their example is a powerful witness to their children and grandchildren who need to address the issues raised by the 'masters of suspicion'.

In a climate of increasing relativism in our Catholic schools where there is limited sense of Catholic identity and mission, it is important that we profess our faith through the example of our lives and a continuing commitment to making a difference in our world. Our prayers for a broken world may not bring immediate change to those who are suffering but our commitment to solidarity with them is part of our Christian witness.

May we be inspired by the example of the 'beloved disciple' and bear witness to our belief and hope in the presence of God in our midst.



RITE OF BLESSING OF THE FAMILY HOME WITH THE EASTER WATER

Reflection

The blessing of a house is primarily a time of prayer for the people who live in it and make it a home. It is an invitation for them to praise God for his many blessings to their family, and a moment for calling down his loving kindness upon them.

(All family members standing in a central room in the house begin by making the sign of the cross.)

Leader: God's peace be in this home.

All: And in all who live here.

Leader: Let us pray.

Hear us Lord, we pray, in your goodness send your angel from heaven to watch over and protect all who live in this home. May we find in this home comfort, love, encouragement, peace and prayer,

we make our prayer in the name of the Risen Lord.

All: Amen

Leader: Let us pray to God for his blessing. (All pause for a moment of silent prayer).

Father in heaven, look upon this family and home in your love, and give us the blessing of your

peace.

Let your Spirit of joy fill our hearts, so that we may be holy and happy.

May our concern for others reflect your love, and bring us happiness throughout this year.

All: We ask through Christ, Our Lord. Amen.

Leader: Bless our home Father and all who live here in peace.

(Accompanied by the whole family the Leader may go to each room of the house and sprinkle it, using a twig or similar object, with the blessed water.)

All: Concluding in the central room with the Our Father prayed together and the sign of the cross.
